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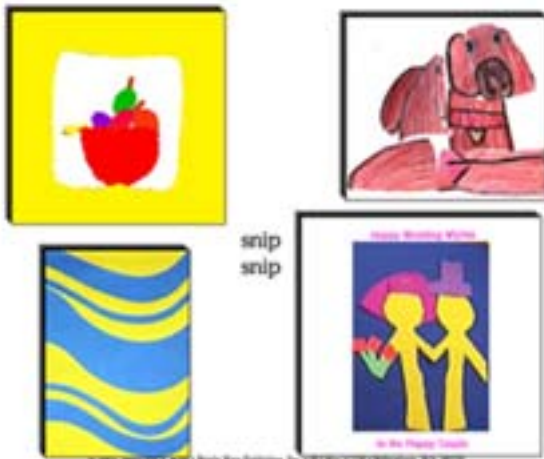

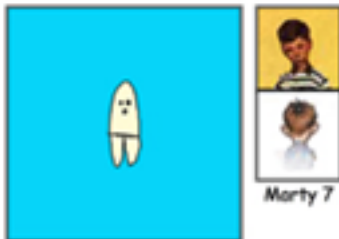

The 3-Step EX-List

• 1. **EX**periment

• 2. **EX**perience

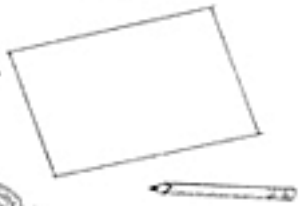
• 3. **EX**ploration

Experiment Watercolor Dry & Wet

- ◆ Draw with water-based markers on plain water
- ◆ next try wet paper



- ◆ Paint with watercolor paint on dry paper
- ◆ next try wet paper



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Experience Penciled Watercolor



- ◆ Draw on paper with pencil.
- ◆ Moisten paper.
- ◆ With watercolors, paint the penciled drawing.

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Explore Design Blend



- ★ Draw and cut out any shape.
- ★ Trace the shape on paper, overlapping the shape.
- ★ Fill in the shape with designs made with water-based markers. Change designs in the overlaps.
- ★ Blend the designs with a wet paintbrush.

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Experiment Build It Blocks

- ◆ Build a village or town with wooden blocks on a paper or cardboard base.
- ◆ Add accessories such as toys, figures, and fallen branches and twigs for landscaping. Add sand for roads.
- ◆ Cut a hole in paper, and fold back the sides to make peep-a-boo openings.
- ◆ Place the peep-a-boo paper over pictures or drawings.



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Experience **Knock, Knock**

- ◆ Design a paper building with windows and doors that open and close.
- ◆ Add characters, figures, objects, and drawings.



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Explore **Winter Village**

- Create a village in winter ... or any time of year ... from milk cartons for buildings and scraps to decorate.



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Experiment **Geo range**

- ◆ Arrange colorful geometric plastic or foam shapes in designs.



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Experience **Geo Art**

- ◆ Bright geometric shapes are assembled into a one-of-a-kind design.

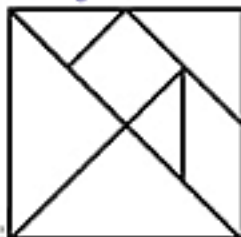


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Explore **GeoGram**



- Work with traditional tangram shapes to create a puzzle, picture, or design.



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Experiment **Beginner Resist**

- ◆ Draw hard and bright with crayons.
- ◆ Paint over crayon with thinned tempera or watercolor paint.



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Experience Lovely Leaf Resist

- ◆ Trace leaves (any shapes) on drawing paper, overlapping shapes.
- ◆ Add details within shapes with crayons.
- ◆ Trace over selected pencil lines with black crayon.
- ◆ Wash over with watercolor paint.



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Explore Oil Pastel Resist

- Draw with oil pastels on paper, and wash over with thinned tempera paint.



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Experiment Foil Squunch

- ◆ Squeeze aluminum foil into balls and snakes.

Experience Lovely Leaf Resist

- ◆ Squeeze foil into long snake snakes, which can be bent and joined together.



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Explore Foil Figure

- Squeeze foil into planned shapes, and wrap with masking tape. Decorate.

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Experiment Fingerpainting

- ◆ Fingerpaint.

Experience Gel Comb Painting

- ◆ Mix paint with hair gel. Cover paper. Drag and draw designs through paint with handmade "combs" and rakes.

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Explore **Tempera Chalk Drawing**

● Mix art mediums. Dip colored chalk into white tempera paint, and draw on colored paper.



● Draw with chalk dipped in water.

◆ Draw with wet chalk. Add paint designs.

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Explore **Series Cartooning**

● Create an original comic strip in 3 or more sections.



● Draw a picture or pictures on paper that tell a story.

◆ Doodlectable: Start from one small shape, and doodle around it, filling the page.

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Explore **Foil Shimmer Mosaic**

● Coat foil with glue/food coloring mixture. Dry. Cut into mosaic pieces. Create a mosaic.



● Cut a picture into strips. Glue together.

◆ Puzzle mosaic: Cut a drawing into 5 pieces. Reassemble with spaces between.

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Explore **Half n' Half Art**

● Draw the missing half of a magazine picture. (The results are amazing.)



● Cut magazine pictures and glue on paper.

◆ Create a "traced transfer" of a magazine picture.

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Explore **Be Wiggly & Squiggly**

● Create a drawing dissected by wiggly lines and changing colors.



● Draw a looping squiggle on paper. Color in the shapes.

◆ Be There & Square: Fold a paper into sections. Draw on it. Color in the sectioned drawing in different colors.

Experiment **Photocopy It**

● Photocopy an image. Experiment with reducing and enlarging

Experience **Photocopy Repeat**

◆ Repeat a copy of a portrait picture. Then decorate each one.

Explore **Posed Imitation**

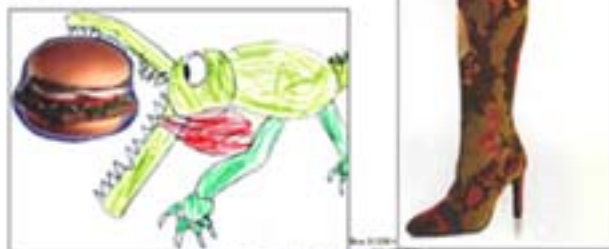


Experiment **Clip and Glue**

- Clip and cut magazine pictures. Glue on paper.

Experience **Clipped Inset Draw**

- ♦ Incorporate a magazine clipping into the essential elements of a drawing.



Explore **Master of Parody**

- A parody imitates a great work of art, often in a humorous way. Example: Mona Lisa The Football Player is below.



- Draw with markers on foil or clear plastic.
- ♦ Mini Master: Create a tiny work of art on a blank slide. Decorate the frame too.

Explore **Great Art & Me**

- Incorporate a photo of oneself into a great work of art.

- Cut a smiling face from a magazine. Draw the rest of the picture.

- ♦ Combine tissue paper and a magazine picture to make a mixed media still life.



Explore **Surreal Clipping**

- Reduce and enlarge magazine pictures, and blend into a surreal drawing composition.
